That leave be given to introduce a Bill to amend the Extradition Act, 1996, so as to provide for the extradition of persons from Namibia to any country on the basis of a multilateral agreement to which Namibia is also a party to; to make it permissible for Namibian citizens to be prosecuted and punished in Namibia in accordance with the laws of Namibia for any extraditable offence which such Namibian citizen may have committed or is accused of having committed within the jurisdiction of a country other than Namibia; to provide for the required evidence to be considered by a magistrate at an enquiry and the discharge of a person at an enquiry when there

is no evidence to extradite the person; to provide for a proper method of authentication of documents; to provide the person with an opportunity to apply for bail; to provide for appeals to the Supreme Court; and to provide for incidental matters.
