**NOTICES OF MOTIONS**

**I. Minister of Finance:**

That this Assembly –

In line with Section 65(8) of the Customs and Excise Act –

*Agrees* to the Amendment of Government Gazette No. 6967 and Notice No. 225 of Part 5A of Schedule No. 1 to Customs and Excise Act of 1998 and Notice No. 226 of Part 3 of Schedule No. 1 to the Customs and Excise Act of 1998.

**II. Minister of Finance:**

That leave be given to introduce a Bill to establish the Office of the Financial Services Adjudicator; to provide for its powers and functions and other matters relating to the Office; to provide for the appointment of the Adjudicator and the powers and functions of the Adjudicator; and to provide for incidental matters.

**III. Minister of Finance:**

That leave be given to introduce a Bill to provide for the continued existence of an Authority to exercise supervision over compliance with financial services laws; to provide for the functions, powers and management of the Authority; to provide for the financing of the Authority; to provide for an Appeal Board to hear and determine certain matters; and to provide for incidental matters.

**IV. Minister of Finance:**

That leave be given to introduce a Bill to consolidate and harmonise the laws regulating financial institutions, financial intermediaries and financial markets in Namibia; and to provide for incidental matters.

**V. Minister of Justice:**

That leave be given to introduce a Bill to give effect to the obligations of Namibia as a State Party to the Convention against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment; to define the offences of torture and other forms of cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment and to provide for matters incidental thereto.

**VI. Minister of Works and Transport:**

That leave be given to introduce a Bill to amend the Prevention and Combating of Pollution of the Sea by Oil Act, 1981, so as to insert some definitions, to substitute the definition of “prohibited are”; to require permission of the Minister for the transfer of oil and other harmful substances between ships and tankers in harbours and prohibited areas; to increase the penalties for certain offences; and to provide for incidental matters.

**VII. Prime Minister:**

That this Assembly –

In accordance with Article 112(3) of the Namibian Constitution –

*Approves* the re-appointment by His Excellency the President of Ms. Florence Munyungano as a member of the Public Service Commission for the period of five (5) years with effect from 1 December 2019 to 31 November 2024.

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
